Lieut.

I have just received  
your letter dated the 29<sup>th</sup> and  
hasten to forward the interes-  
ting document. I would  
not have taken it from the  
office if I had any idea of  
you sending for it, and  
I am glad to hear that the  
course I pursued meets  
with your approbation. When  
I took it out I supposed  
it would reach you sooner  
than you get it by sending.  
I took the liberty of speeking  
it on the strength of Official  
Business. It will give  
me pleasure to comply with  
your request and forward



any that are hereafter advertised. I am glad to hear that you have gone to work and think you can make more money at two dollars a day than you could in the Army at four and a half.

I saw Jones about a week ago and we talked of coming up to see you but account of the press of business we were obliged to postpone it. Jones went to Boston last Saturday and I believe intends going into business there. I shall try to come out and see you some day next month. I think now of going to New York the first of next week to spend the next Thanksgiving day there.

Commissions for the 14<sup>th</sup> U.S. C. A. (Ky) came on for Capt. S. Metcalf. Addeman & Cragin and for Lt. Barney, but Lt. Barney is the only one who thinks of going. Col. Bailey wrote on to ask why more did not come and they said that they had concluded not to send any more as all Colored troops were to be mustered out of the service. I have no idea of going into Military again in fact would not go under any consideration.

I am not doing any thing yet and think it likely that I shall not until Spring.

I want you visit - I have most of the officers and want you so I shall ex-
