400 Couples Are Dancing At Gala Formal

CORONATION OF QUEEN HIGHLIGHTS EVENING

Amid a galaxy of revolving lights, approximately 400 couples are dancing this evening in the Crystal Ballroom of the Sheraton-Biltmore Hotel to the music of Raymond Scott and his eighteen-piece orchestra on the occasion of the Providence Junior Promenade, sponsored by the Class of 1948.

When the college "Alma Mater Song" is played at 11:00 p. m., the formal affair will reach its climax with the commencing of the Grand March, led by the members of the Prom Committee and their guests. Committee members are identified by their bluish boutonnieres and red ribbons.

Immediately following this procession will be the coronation of the Promenade Queen, Miss Elizabeth Peirce of Providence. Her escort is Mr. Dan Di Iuglio of New Haven, Prom Chairman and class Secretary. Maid of Honor to the Queen is Miss Frances Stickley of Wakefield, R. I., guest of Mr. Thomas Barry of Coventry, R. I., class President. The Queen and her Maid of Honor will carry arm bouquets of roses. Mr. Barry, on behalf of the Junior Class, will present Miss Peirce with a silver loving cup as a symbol of her royal status for the evening.

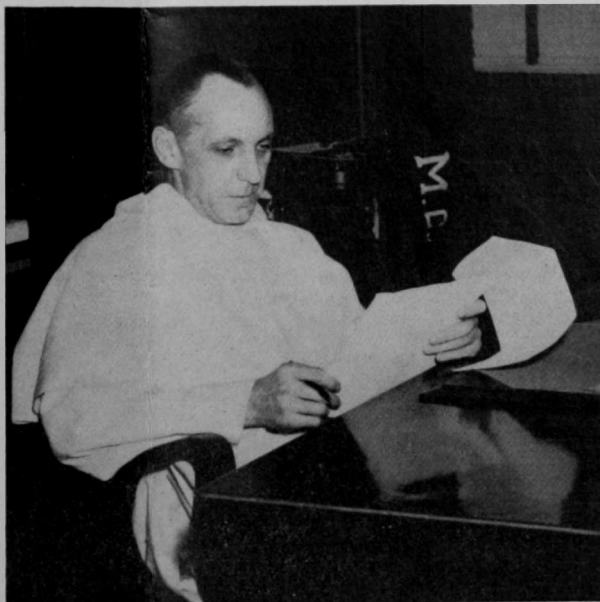

The Rev. William R. Clark, O.P., and the members of the photography staff of the college yearbook, THE VERITAS, for most of the pictures contained in this special issue.

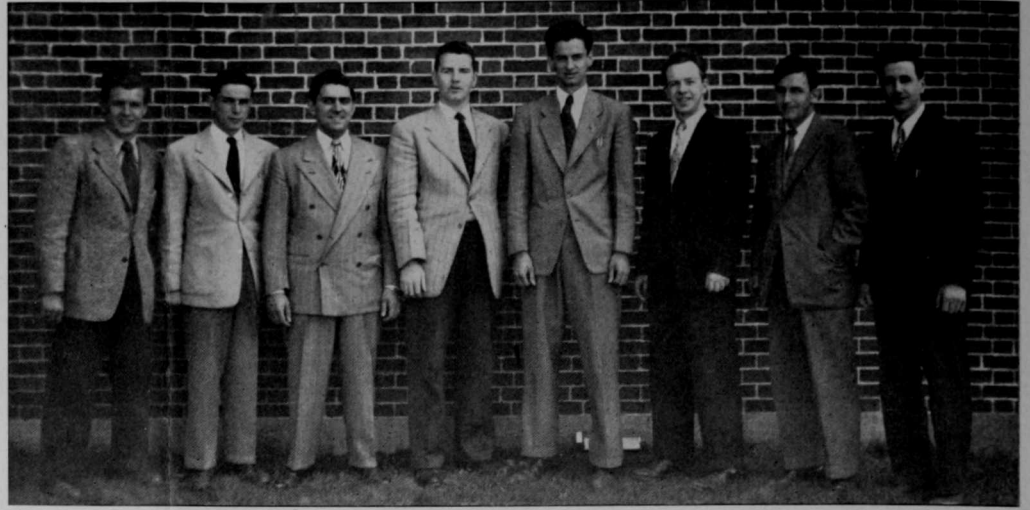

PROM FEATURES DANCE MUSIC OF 18-PIECE BAND

Raymond Scott wields his baton this evening as his eighteen-piece orchestra provides the dance music for the annual Junior Promenade.

Ranking among the first ten of the nation, his latest band has been currently billed with the more exclusive hotels and ballrooms in Chicago, St. Louis, New York City, Philadelphia, and San Francisco. They are now making a tour throughout the east at college dances with great success.

Mr. Scott himself is a composer of note. Among his more than 150 works are "Twilight in Turkey," "The Toy Trumpet," "In a Magic Garden," and "Huckleberry Duck." He wrote the score for the famous money-making musical comedy, "Lute Song," starring Mary Martin of radio and screen fame in a Chinese setting.

His unique style of dance music, called "symphonies for dance bands" has been acclaimed by modern music critics everywhere. His new band, hailed as the "band of the month" for April of this year, has been described as "a pleasant medium between that of the late Glenn Miller and that of Harry James."
