THE SIX HUNDRETH
ANNIVERSARY OF THE DEATH OF
ST. CATHERINE OF SIENA

Providence College takes great pride in honoring St. Catherine of Siena. A mystic and apostle in the Dominican Order, St. Catherine was born in Siena, Italy on March 25, 1347. Having vowed at an early age, to live in perpetual virginity, she became a Dominican tertiary at the age of sixteen. Though she continued to live in the very active house of her family, she gave herself to a life of intense prayer and penance. Then, when she was twenty-three, the Lord called Catherine to be in the midst of mankind. In her vigorous apostolic life this Dominican woman gave spiritual guidance to a variety of men and women, acted as ambassador between the Florentines and the Pope, cared for the victims of the Black Plague, and persuaded Pope Gregory XI to leave Avignon and return to Rome. Finally, when the Great Schism divided the Church, Catherine labored indefatigably to heal the split through letters to the leaders of Christendom and constant prayer. Then, having exhausted her strength for the sake of unity in the Church, she offered herself as a sacrificial victim for the Church and died on April 29, 1380. Her teaching on the spiritual life is contained in her numerous letters of guidance and especially in her *Dialogue*.
