BIOGRAPHIES

JOHN GARRITY (Director) is an Associate Professor of Theatre, former Chair of the Theatre Department and producing director of the Blackfriars Summer Theatre from 1986 to 1988. Mr. Garrity has served on the Rhode Island State Council on the Arts, and as president of the Rhode Island Playwrights Theatre. He has worked at Olney Theatre in Maryland, the Nantucket Stage Company and the Block Island Stage Company. His directing credits include Candide, 1776, Working, Playboy of the Western World, Saint Joan, A Doll's House, Metamorphosis, Our Country's Good, which was selected to participate in the American College Theatre Regional Festival at Fairfield University, and last season's Edith Stein.

DAVID E. SULLIVAN (Assistant Director) is a 1992 graduate of Providence College with a B.A. in Theater Arts. While at P.C. he appeared in the Blackfriars Theatre productions of *Our Country's Good, The Glass Menagerie*, and *Into the Woods*. Presently he is pursuing an M.A. in Theatre Arts at Brown University.

DAVID COSTA-CABRAL (Costume Designer) serves in the double capacity as Managing Director of the Blackfriars Theatre and Resident Costume Designer. His most recent works for the P.C. stage are *Edith Stein, Arms and the Man,* and *The Wizard of Oz.* In the spring of 1992, he costumed a remarkable production of Stephen Sondheim's *Follies* for the Boston Conservatory of Music. He would like to dedicate his work this season to the memory of Jean Eckart.

BRIAN JONES (Scenic/Lighting Designer): This is Brian's first design for the Blackfriars Theatre. He comes to us from Weber State University in Ogden, Utah where he was a scenic and lighting designer for the past six years. He holds his MFA from the University of Florida and has over 120 design credits from Florida to Utah. Most recent designs have been as varied as *Hamlet* at Theatre-Works West, *Pumpboys and Dinettes* at Utah Musical Theatre and *FF: The Brontes* at the Salt Lake Acting Co.. He looks forward to continued creative success and friendship with his students and colleagues in New England, but hopes also to someday found a U.S. Beckett Festival in Moab, Utah. He is not a tap dancer—that's the other guy.

WENDY OLIVER (Movement Consultant): Ms. Oliver (EdD, Columbia University; MFA Temple University) has been Assistant Professor of Dance in the Theatre Department since 1985, where she has choreographed several musicals including *Once Upon a Mattress, Evita*, and *The Wizard of Oz*, and has also served as director of the Providence College Dance Company. From 1976-1981, Ms. Oliver danced professionally with the Minneapolis-based company Contactworks, a dance company dedicated to the performance of contact improvisation and choreographed works based on contact. She has taught and performed contact extensively in the U.S., and has received choreographic awards from the Minnesota State Arts Board and the National Endowment for the Arts.






