Billbob Brown is an Associate Professor in Dance at UMass Amherst. He received his BFA from Arizona State University and MA (in Dance History and Criticism) from the University of New Mexico. Billbob has created and directed shows at the Tony Award-winning Utah Shakespearean Festival, and choreographed and performed in TV work and commercials for the Chicago Cubs, Molson Canadian Beer, Disney Studios, and ABC-TV, several of which have received national and international awards. He has toured nationally with the Bill Evans Dance Company, was co-founder and artistic director of Desert Dance Theatre in Phoenix (now in its 30th year), with whom he still works, and, in Albuquerque, was director of Buen Viaje Dancers, a group of people with disabilities. He has taught and performed in Japan, England, Switzerland, and throughout Mexico and the United States. Billbob is presently the artistic director of Chaos Theory Dance, a company that performs funny dances about science and other odd subjects.

Tim Cryan (Lighting Design) is a New York based lighting designer whose work has been seen in the United States and Europe. Specializing in Dance and Theatre, Tim has had the opportunity to collaborate with a variety of artists including: Circus Smirkus; Fiasco Theater Company Cymbeline (dir. Noah Brody & Ben Steinfeld); Fusionworks Dance Company (dir. Deb Meuiner), Nature Theatre of Oklahoma Poetics-a Ballet Brut (dir. Pavol Liska); Workhorse Theatre Ensemble (dir. Stephen Buescher). Previous lighting designs for Providence College include: Twelfth Night, The Cripple of Inishmaan, The Effect of Gamma Rays on Man-in-the-Moon Marigolds, Gypsy, Hedda Gabler, Little Women, Poor Murderer, Urinetown, Waiting for Lefty, and the Fall 2009, 2010, & 2011 Blackfriars Dance Concerts. In addition to his work as a designer Tim is also an adjunct faculty member of the Dance Department at Long Island University & the theatre program of Bard College at Simon's Rock. http://timcryan.net

Kimberleigh Holman is the artistic director of Luminarium Dance Company; she graduated from Mount Holyoke College with a degree in dance, where she also studied with several prominent lighting and sound designers. As a choreographer she prefers to fuse her dance and life experience, focusing on body shapes in the performance space and creating work that has its own active presence and personality. The most central idea to Holman's philosophies as a choreographer is that the work needs to be visual and accessible, leaving viewers with something they can take away from the performance: an invisible memento. Since founding Luminarium Dance Company in 2010, Holman has been invited to show her work at the Boston Center for the Arts, the Center for Arts at the Armory, mobiüs, and many other venues. She, with Luminarium, was awarded the President's Innovation Fund award for a community outreach program merging the company with the Boys and Girls Clubs of Boston in 2011, and has been invited to speak at Mount Holyoke College and at the Arsenal

Center for the Arts. Currently, Kim is working on a commissioned piece in collaboration with a composer at Ithaca College.

Rod Luther is a jazz pianist who performs the music of Gershwin, Ellington, Porter, Berlin and others in Rhode Island. He is a founding member of the Providence Piano Club, and a member of the jazz group in residence at First Unitarian Church in Providence. He is also the pianist for the Olney Street Baptist Church in Providence, and accompanies the Providence College Gospel Choir. Luther has studied jazz with David Darling, Stanley Cowell, Norman Simmons and at the Naropa Institute in Boulder, Colorado. Luther was the recipient of a 2011 Pawtucket Arts Panel grant, which funded his solo concert as part of the Pawtucket Arts Festival.

Katie McNamara is a dance artist, a cook, a mother and a teacher. Along with her husband Olase Freeman, she co-directs their company, BaldSoul, within which they strive to find the locus where art and life coexist. Katie spent her preliminary professional years in Philadelphia where she danced with Group Motion, Scrap Performance Group and Leah Stein Dance Company. During this time she also co-founded and directed the Bald Mermaids, named "best new modern dance company" by Philadelphia's City Paper. Her work has been shown at the Philadelphia Fringe Festival, Philadelphia's Painted Bride Art Center, the Carriage House, Galapagos Art Space, the Projekt Theatre (Dresden, Germany) as well as during the Silesian Dance Festival (Bytom, Poland). Her recent choreographic residencies include Rhode Island College Dance Company, Providence College Dance Company, Roger Williams University and Salve Regina University. Katie has had a twelve year career as a Pilates practitioner and teacher and is PMA certified. She is pursuing a MFA in dance at University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and preparing for her solo thesis concert in the spring.

Erin McNulty, a Massachusetts native and 2011 graduate of Boston University, is a contemporary dancer with KAIROS Dance Theater under the direction of DeAnna Pellecchia and Ingrid Schatz. She performs regularly in the Boston area with KAIROS, and has recently shown her own solo work at the Third Life Studio Choreographer Series and RAW Artists:Boston. Erin has also performed as a dancer in All the Pretty Horses, an outdoor production with horses put on by Paula Josa-Jones/Performance Works in New York. In addition to choreographing for PC this fall, Erin has also been teaching dance classes for an after-school program in the Cambridge elementary schools and working full-time for Youth-Build USA.

Betsy Miller is a dance artist and educator based in Providence, RI. She is a free-lance choreographer and co-director of Propel-her Dance Collective (www. propelherdance.com), and is a Special Lecturer in Dance at Providence College. She currently performs with Fusionworks Dance Company, and has recently danced in works by Terry Creach, Doug Varone, Michael Kelly Bruce, Ming Shen Ku, Kristin O'Neal, Shawn Hove, and Marden Ramos, and in collaborations with Matthew Cumbie, Maggie Bennett and Erik Abbott-Main. Her choreography has been presented in various venues in New York City, Ohio, Maine, Connecticut, Rhode Island, Massachusetts and Texas. She holds an MFA in Dance from The Ohio State University and a BA in Dance from Connecticut College.

Wendy Oliver is Professor of Dance and Chair of the Department of Theatre, Dance, and Film at Providence College. After graduating from college, she studied in New York City with Merce Cunningham and Viola Farber, then moved to Minneapolis, where she performed with the dance company Contactworks, touring and teaching in the Upper Midwest. Her choreography has been performed in New York, Philadelphia, and the Midwest, and has been recognized by the Minnesota State Arts Board and the National Endowment for the Arts. She has an MFA from Temple University and an EdD from Columbia University. Oliver directs the PC Dance Company and the Dance Minor Program. Her book Writing about Dance was published with Human Kinetics Press in 2010, and she has recently been named Editor-in-Chief of the Journal of Dance Education, an international publication.
