CHOREOGRAPHERS

HEATHER AHERN

As a founding member of Groundwerx Dance Theatre, Providence, RI, Ahern co-directed, toured, performed, and taught nationally for fifteen years. In 2012, Ahern founded Aerplaye dance company as choreographer and Artistic Director. She has been awarded three grants from the Rhode Island State Council on the Arts: An Artist Project Grant for the creation of a one-woman dance/play, "Amazons, Goddesses, and Others"; an Individual Artists Grant for the creation of a dance-theatre work, "In Full Flight", and more recently for a solo work entitled "100 Years of Disquietude: Love in the Time of Corona". Ahern has performed, taught, and choreographed work for a variety of populations at colleges, universities and other institutions throughout the country. She has taught in the dance programs of CSU, Long Beach; Long Beach City College; West Virginia University (as Director of Dance Program); University of Tampa, Hillsborough Community College, Tampa Florida, Rhode Island College, and Providence College. She is also a certified Pilates Instructor specializing in Dance Conditioning, teaches at Club Pilates, Rhode Island, and is a certified Kripalu Yoga teacher. Ahern is proud to be a performing member of the band, The Gillen Street Ensemble.

LAURA BENNETT

Laura Bennett is managing director of Dancing Legacy and school director of Fusionworks Dance Center. A Brown University graduate, she has studied, performed, and taught techniques and repertory of the 20th century American concert dance lineage, beginning with her early training at the Harlem Dance Studio, led by her mother Julie Adams Strandberg and her aunt Carolyn Adams. She holds a dance education certificate from 92nd Street Y, New York, and has taught dance and theater in schools, colleges, community centers, private studios, and summer programs, including 33 years at the New York State Summer School of the Arts School of Dance where she was associate artistic director. Outside of dance, Laura enjoys spending time with her family, traveling, studying the Bible, following sports, and listening to podcasts.

NINA KOSSLER

Nina Kossler is an Assistant Professor of Dance at Providence college. She has previously taught at the University of North Carolina Greensboro, Valdosta State University, Ball State University, and Purdue University. She has also taught for Mark Morris Dance Group and Liberate Artists. She holds an MFA in Dance (Choreography) from the University of North Carolina Greensboro, and a BA in Dance from Muhlenberg College.

Her concert and screen dance choreography has been presented at the Global Water Dances Film Festival, the Identically Different Dance Festival (Brooklyn, NY), Dance New Jersey (Manalapan, NJ), The Fishbowl Collective (New York, NY), the ChEcK Us OuT Dance Festival (Queens, NY), the American College Dance Association Screendance Festival, as well as numerous universities and regional dance organizations.

Nina has performed as a company member of Crossroads Dance Indy, a nonprofit multigenre dance company, and as a collaborator with Ballet INitiative.

CHOREOGRAPHERS

JESSICA T. PEARSON

Jessica T. Pearson (she/her) is an Associate Professor of Dance at Rhode Island College. Ms. Pearson is a dancer, educator and choreographer who danced with the Cleo Parker Robinson Dance Ensemble, Gesel Mason, Concepts In Motion (Bermuda), and Denizen Arts. As an educator of modern dance traditions, she has been invited to teach at Ballet West Summer Intensive, Brown University, Providence College, Urbanity Summer Intensive, University of Kentucky Lexington, Festival Ballet, and has taught overseas.

Her choreography has been selected to perform at Boston Contemporary Dance Festival, Southern Vermont Dance Festival and Collective Thread (NY). Urbanity Next, Utah Regional Ballet, Rhode Island College, Salve Regina University, University of Kentucky Lexington, University of Utah, and Providence College have commissioned choreography by Ms. Pearson.

Ms. Pearson was a principal dancer in Hocus Pocus 2 and recently joined SAG-AFTRA. Prior to Rhode Island College, she was a Post MFA Fellow at the University of Utah. She received her MFA in Dance from the University of Colorado Boulder where she studied dance pedagogy and choreography and BFA in Dance from Towson University in Towson, Maryland.

MICHAELA PENDOLA

Michaela Pendola is a Rhode Island based Dance Instructor and Choreographer. She is a graduate of Rhode Island College where she studied both Musical Theatre and Dance and currently is an MFA Candidate at Jacksonville University, studying Choreography. Michaela is the full-time Dance Instructor at La Salle Academy, where she is also the Director of the LSA Dance Company and Head Coach of the LSA Dance Team.

BROOKLYN TOLI

Brooklyn Toli is a Boston-based educator, arts administrator and performing artist. She currently serves as a faculty member at the Boston Conservatory at Berklee teaching jazz and tap dance, is the Administrative Associate for Dorrance Dance, and is a founding member of Fourth Dimension Tap Company, a professional tap company striving to ignite the interest of new patrons to the art form. Brooklyn has served as the choreographer for New Bedford Festival Theater for the past three years and received the BroadwayWorld Boston "Best Choreography of a Musical" award for her work on Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat. In 2020, Brooklyn started "Sisters Support Success," an organization that works to support arts accessibility, and awards an annual \$1,000 scholarship to a high school senior committed to volunteerism. Brooklyn holds a B.A. in Dance Performance and Musical Theater from Rhode Island College, and is currently earning an M.F.A in Performing Arts Management from Brooklyn College.

ARLYNN ZACHARY

Arlynn Zachary has an MFA in choreography from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro (UNCG), a BA in choreography from Goucher College (Magna Cum Laude), and an AA degree from Central Piedmont Community College (CPCC). She has performed in works by Kim Robards, Charles Weidman, Doris Humphrey, Martha Graham, Sean Curran, and Jennifer Archibald, among others. She has worked for Echo Contemporary Dance Company, Moving Poets Charlotte, The Wake Project, Baran Dance, and Taproot Ensemble, in the capacities of dancer, rehearsal director, stage manager, and lighting designer. She has served on the boards of the KinetiCollective, Charlotte Dance Festival, and Dance Artist Alliance CLT, and was the Director of Dance for the Charlotte New Music Festival's Dance Co-Lab. Her choreography has been displayed at the American College Dance Association, Goucher College, UNCG, Winthrop University (WU), Columbia College, Furman University, Johnson C. Smith University (JCSU), La Roche University, Belmont Abbey College, North Carolina Dance Festival, Greensboro Fringe Festival, Charlotte Dance Festival, Charlotte New Music Festival, Detroit Dance City Festival, SoloDuo Dance Festival, Emergence Showcase, and with Bodiography Contemporary Ballet, to name a few. She was the Artistic Director of THE MARK dance company for 12 years before retiring from dance in 2023, due to injuries sustained in a car collision in 2022. She is currently a dance photographer in Charlotte, NC.

LIGHTING DESIGNER

MICHAEL CLARK WONSON

Michael has worked in the United States and abroad for the past 25 years, Highlights include designs for The Bar Girl of Jamaica at The University of the West Indies in Jamaica, Boston Lyric Opera, Cumberland County Playhouse in Tennessee, Southern Methodist University School of Theatre, Dance and Opera, New Bedford Festival Theater, The Lyric Stage Company, Eastern Slope Playhouse, Deertrees Theater, The Five Colleges MFA and Faculty dance department of western Massachusetts, Boston Conservatory, Seacoast Repertory Theatre in Portsmouth NH, Providence College department of theater, dance, and film, and the Courthouse Center for the Arts in Kingston, Rhode Island. His designs have received numerous awards. He also designs full theatrical lighting systems and oversees installation. He is looking forward to opening his first off Broadway production this fall.
