

Choreographer Biographies

Guests and Faculty

Sarah McCormick, whose style is influenced by the work of Agnes DeMille and Pina Bausch, has had her works produced in Los Angeles, New York, Seattle, Iowa University, Bates College in Maine, Barcelona and Vienna. From 1990-1995, she was artistic director and choreographer of Tyndale/Sarah Pogostin, a seven member company based in New York City. Since 1989, she has taught modern dance technique in both Los Angeles and New York. Currently, she resides in Rhode Island as a freelance choreographer and is developing a program that combines dance and art.

Deb Meunier is the Artistic Director of Fusionworks, a Rhode Island dance company founded in 1987. Her works have been commissioned and performed throughout the Northeast including Rhode Island College, Brown University, WORKS Contemporary Dance of Hartford, Jacob's Pillow, Dance Services Network, Artspace of New Haven, and the 92nd St. YMCA of New York City, among others. In 1996, she received a choreography fellowship from the RI State Council on the Arts; she has also received a Cirino Fellowship for her work in arts education. and the Rulewater Prize from Weslevan University for her work on an interdisciplinary choreographic residency with the RI School for the Deaf. Meunier also runs Fusionworks Dance Academy in Lincoln, RI.

Wendy Oliver, MFA, EdD, Associate Professor of Dance, has been teaching and choreographing at Providence College since 1985. Prior to becoming a member of the faculty, she performed with the Minneapolis-based company Contactworks. Her choreography has been performed in New York. Philadelphia, Providence, and throughout Minnesota and the Upper Midwest. She is a past recipient of grants for choreography from the National Endowment for the Arts and the Minnesota State Arts Board. She recently co-edited a book entitled Women Making Art: Women in the Visual, Literary and Performing Arts since 1960, which was published early in 2001 by Peter Lang Press. She is currently working on a dance textbook for middle and high school students.
