### What is Readers' Theatre?

A Stocking Full of Christmas Stories is a readers' theatre production. Readers' theatre is a hybrid art form that may be as old as Hrosvitha of Gandersheim, the first woman playwright and a tenth century Benedictine nun who wrote plays to be done as staged readings by the sisters in her abbey. It is a cross between storytelling and a full theatrical production. For the actor it means suggesting a character rather than becoming it. It allows him or her to portray a much older person, a dog or the North Wind without the benefit of a costume. For the audience member it means using the imagination to a greater degree than in a traditional play or movie. One of the great advantages of readers' theatre is that it allows us to perform pieces of literature that, unlike plays, were not written to be performed. selections that we will perform in A Stocking Full of Christmas Stories are short stories, essays and poems that we have adapted for the stage. The authors intended for them to be read, but we hope that they will also succeed as performance pieces.

You will notice the presence of books in the actors' hands. This is not because we have actors who are too lazy to memorize lines. Since readers' theatre makes use of a great deal of narration and direct address to the audience, the script serves as a reminder of the storytelling aspect of the art form. It emphasizes that the actors, as a group rather than an individual, are reading a story to you and only suggesting the action. We allow your imagination to do the rest. The book also serves as a symbol of the author, whose presence we do not forget in readers' theatre.

You might compare readers' theatre to being in the studio audience in the golden age of radio drama and comedy. Or you might think of readers' theatre as a story hour for adults.

## Biographies

Paul LaRochelle (Lighting Design) is a sophomore biology major at Providence College. He has designed lighting for several productions for high school, college, and community theater, including Annie, Genesis, Nunsense, Wait Until Dark, Noises Off, Ten Little Indians, Mame, Friar's Cell and BOPs GI Jive and Mr. Providence. Aside from being a lighting designer, Paul is the drummer for on campus alternative rock band Dollar 95, as well as a DJ and board member for 91.3 WDOM FM. He resides in Pawtucket, Rhode Island.

Father Matthew Powell, O.P. (compiler & director) is an associate professor of theatre arts and former chairman of the theatre department. He holds an M.A. in speech and theatre from Miami University (Ohio), an M.A. in theology from Aquinas Institute (Iowa) and a Ph.D. in theatre history & dramatic literature from the University of Wisconsin at Madison. He formerly taught at Urbana University (Ohio) and Edgewood College (Wisconsin) and served as assistant Catholic chaplain at Tulane University (Louisiana). He has been at Providence College since 1983.

Father Powell is the author of three books: The Christmas Creche: Treasure of Faith, Art & Theatre

(Pauline Books & Media), God Off-Broadway: The Blackfriars Theatre of New York (Scarecrow Press), and Performing Parables: Religious Folk Tales, Legends & Fables for Readers Theatre (Resource Publications). His one-act dramatization of The Canterville Ghost was published in the U.S. by Meriwether Publishing and in Britain by Hanbury Plays. The Christmas Creche won an award from the Catholic Press Association of the U.S. & Canada and God Off-Broadway was nominated for the George Freedly Memorial Award, presented by the Theatre Library Association.

A Stocking Full of Christmas Stories is Father Powell's twelfth directing project at PC. He has previously directed works by George Bernard Shaw, Oscar Wilde, Thornton Wilder and Tennessee Williams.
