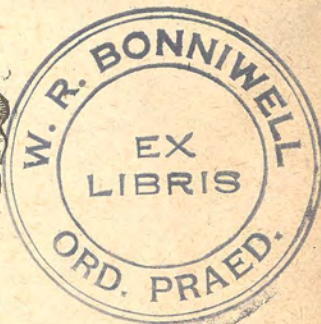

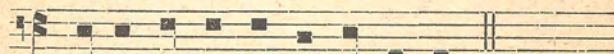
THIS little Compline Book is intended to supply a want that must have been felt by many who attend the Devotions of Compline in Dominican Churches.

It may be well to remind the Faithful that a Special Indulgence may be gained by all who attend during any of the Divine Offices, and, if possible, in the singing of the Holy Psalms by which so much praise is given to our Creator.

An Indulgence of three years and three quarantines may be gained by the Members of the Confraternity of the Holy Rosary as often as they attend at the singing of the "Salve Regina" provided they recite one "Hail Mary."

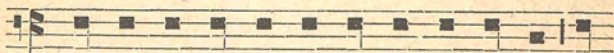
A Plenary Indulgence is gained by all who attend during the Processions which are made on the First Sunday of the month in honour of Our Lady the Queen of the Holy Rosary; on the Second Sunday during the Procession in honour of the Most Holy Name of Jesus; and in many places on the Third Sunday in honour of the Blessed Sacrament.
