July 29th 1861

A H Cameron Esq

Dear Sir enclosed
you have tax redemption certificate
all right. We have had money
& fear panics so much that I
have neglected your matter some
what. It all right now.
The Patent has not been set
at the land office. neither for
you or Mr Peller. I will hold
the duplicates subject to your
orders. I shall be advised
when the Patents are ready for
delivery. I have a son in the
2^d Wisconsin Regt who has
passed through two battles.
In the last battle a bullet passed
through a young man from this
City (killing him instantly) & broke

the stock of my son's gun, who
stood directly behind him.

My son writes me, if he had not
enlisted for 3 years he would
do it now for he wants the
satisfaction of seeing the rebels
cleaned out, Wisconsin is wide
awake, we raise an other
company in this city, 2 companies
have already gone.

We must have men enough to
crush the rebels.
