JOURNAL OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION

Providence, Rhode Island

August 21, 1967

The Convention was called to order by Mr. Dennis J. Roberts, Chairman, at 2:15 P.M.

The roll of delegates was called - there were 78 present and 20 absent.

Absentees were:

Mmes. Barber, Castiglia, Messrs. Crandall, Dodge, Fanning of Cumberland, Feeney, Gallagher, Gallogly, Gammino, Mrs. Lacroix, Messrs. Laporte, Macari, Manning, Martin, Moon, Murphy of Coventry, Murray, Prince, Toolin and Willey.

The names of the absentees were called.

The Chairman announced that although the copies of the Journal of the previous session as distributed to the delegates recorded consideration of Article VII out of its actual order, the official record contained the proper sequence.

On motion of Mr. Wexler, seconded by Mr. Cochran, the reading of the Journal of the previous day was dispensed, on a voice vote.

THIRD READING

In order for third reading was the following which had been considered through Article VII at the previous session of the Convention:

CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF RHODE ISLAND AND PROVIDENCE PLANTATIONS (Proposal No. 20 Substitute C, 25, 26 Substitute B, 27 Substitute B, 28, 29 Substitute B, 30 Substitute B, 31 Substitute B, 32 Substitute B, 33 Substitute B, 34 Substitute B, 35 Substitute C, 36, 37, 39 Substitute A, 41 Substitute B, 155 Substitute D, 171 Substitute C, 190 Substitute B.)

(The Committee of the Whole recommends adoption as amended.)

Mr. Doris, seconded by Mr. Foster, moved that the Convention reconsider Article VII which had failed of adoption at the previous session of the Convention.

Mr. Corcoran, recognized on a point of order, submitted that under general rules of parliamentary procedure the motion was out of order.

The Chairman ruled that the motion was proper under Convention rules which, in such respects, supercede normal rules of parliamentary procedure.

On a division vote the motion to reconsider prevailed, 50 delegates voting in the affirmative and 12 delegates voting in the negative.

Mr. Doris, seconded by Mr. Foster, moved that Article VII be laid on the table.

Mr. LaSalle, recognized on a point of order, submitted that the motion to lay on the table was improper.

The Chairman ruled that under Convention rules the motion to lay on the table was properly in order.

On a division vote the motion to lay on the table prevailed, 46 delegates voting in the affirmative and 17 delegates voting in the negative.

The Chairman declared the consideration of Article VIII to be in order.

Mr. Kagan, seconded by Messrs. Foster and Lawrence, moved that Article VIII be adopted as amended.

The motion to adopt Article VIII, as amended, prevailed on a roll call vote, 71 delegates voting in the affirmative, 0 delegates voting in the negative and 27 delegates absent or not voting as follows:

"I move to amend Article VII Of Elections, Section 1 by striking out in line 1 'all members of the general assembly' and inserting the word 'senators'; and by adding to the section the following: 'Members of the house of representatives shall be elected at a general election on the Tuesday next after the first Monday in November every two years and shall severally hold their offices for two years from the first Tuesday of January next succeeding their election and until their successors are elected and qualified.' •

They shall severally hold their offices for two years from the first Tuesday in January next succeeding their election and until their successors are elected and qualified."
