JOURNAL OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION

Providence, Rhode Island

September 11, 1967

The Convention was called to order by Mr. Dennis J. Roberts, Chairman, at 2:10 P.M.

The roll of delegates was called; there were 84 present and 14 absent.

Absentees were:

Mr. Appolonia, Mrs. Capuano, Messrs. Cunningham, DeCiantis, Dodge, Gallagher, Gammino, Gmelin, Mrs. Lacroix, Messrs. Moon, Mulligan, Parrillo, Stapleton and Toolin.

The names of the absentees were called.

On motion of Mr. Wexler, seconded by Mr. Murphy of Tiverton, the reading of the Journal of the previous day was dispensed, on a voice vote.

THIRD READING

In order for third reading was the following which had been considered completely by article at previous sessions of the Convention:

(The Committee of the Whole recommends adoption as amended.)

The Chairman declared consideration, as a whole, to be in order.

Mr. Doris, seconded by Messrs. Cote and Wrenn, moved that the Constitution as a whole be adopted as amended.

The motion was debated.

At 2:35 the Chairman yielded the rostrum to Mr. David D. Warren, First Vice Chairman.

Mr. Gorham of Foster, for himself and several other delegates, presented a written minority report.

Debate of the motion continued.

At 2:45 the Chairman again took the rostrum.

The motion to adopt prevailed on a roll call vote, 62 delegates voting in the affirmative, 20 delegates voting in the negative and 16 delegates absent or not voting as follows:

The motion to amend prevailed on a voice vote.

Mr. Doris, seconded by Messrs. Bizier and Viall, moved that the resolution be amended by adding to the list of delegates to serve on the Committee the name of Hugo L. Ricci of Providence.

The motion to amend prevailed on a voice vote.

Mr. Cochran, seconded by Messrs. Viall, Cote, Bizier and Ricci, moved passage of the resolution as amended.

On a division vote the motion prevailed, 65 delegates voting in the affirmative and 0 delegates voting in the negative.

Mr. Doris offered Resolution No. 43 entitled, "RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR PRINTING OF THE PROPOSED CONSTITUTION".

The resolution was read.

Mr. Doris, seconded by Mr. Cote, moved passage of the resolution.

On a division vote the motion prevailed, 70 delegates voting in the affirmative and 0 delegates voting in the negative.

The Chairman announced that the Committee elected to conduct public hearings would meet at the rise of the Convention.

Messrs. Viall and Kagan offered Resolution No. 44, entitled "RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE SIGNING OF THE CONSTITUTION BY DELEGATES".

The resolution was read.

Mr. Kagan, seconded by Messrs. Viall, Cote, and McGrath moved passage of the resolution.

On a division vote the motion prevailed, 61 delegates woting in the affirmative and 0 delegates voting in the negative.

Mr. Cochran offered Resolution No. 45 entitled, "RESOLUTION OF FINAL ADJOUR-MENT".

The resolution was read.

Mr. Doris, seconded by Mr. Cote, moved that the resolution be laid on the table.

The Chairman announced that the rules require that three full days pass after introduction of the resolution before it may be considered.

The motion to lay on the table prevailed, 65 delegates voting in the affirmative and 0 delegates voting in the negative.

Mr. Wexler offered Resolution No. 46 entitled, "RESOLUTION WISHING JOHN J. TOOLIN A SPEEDY RECOVERY FROM HIS PRESENT ILLNESS".

The resolution was read.

Mr. Wexler, seconded by the entire membership, moved passage of the resolution.

The motion prevailed on a unanimous rising vote.

Mr. Murphy of Tiverton announced that the Committee on Public Information would meet at the rise of the Convention.

ADJOURNMENT

At 3:31 P.M. on motion of Mr. Doris, seconded by Messrs. Wexler and Foster, the Convention adjourned on a voice vote.
