MILITARY DIVISION OF WEST MISSISSIPPI, New Orleans, La., December 8th, 1864.

Circular No. 10, from these Headquarters, defining the *Pay District of the Gulf*, is hereby modified by the following Circular No. 24, dated Paymaster General's Office, Washington, November 17th, 1864:

"Circular No. 20, current series, of this office, establishing certain "Pay Districts, is hereby modified as follows:

"The boundary between the Pay Districts of the Gulf, and of Mis-"souri and the Mississippi, will be the northern boundary of Louisi-"ana on the west of the Mississippi river, and a continuation of the "line of such northern boundary drawn through the State of Mis-"sissippi, east of the river."

As directed in Circular No. 10, all regimental and battery commanders, within the limits of the *Pay District of the Gulf*, will forward, direct to its Headquarters, in this city, their muster for pay rolls, as soon after muster day as possible, in order that Paymasters may be assigned to their several duties, without unnecessary delay.
