Lonsdale R.I.

April 24, 1860.

Friend Cameron,

I think it is about time that you wrote to a fellow, what are you doing all this time? why dont you come down and see some body, if I had been working as long as you have I would not mind coming to see a "feller" once in a while.

I have forgotten whether I wrote to you that I am working at this place; I have been here six weeks, I have charge of 16 thousand Spindles finer rate place to work.

I have not seen Jones yet, he started for Colorado

Colorado some time ago
and I have ^{not} seen anybody
that knows his address
there.

I saw a lady at Bassett
ton just before I came
home, that wore a dress
which was very short
in front, you may draw
your inference,

write me and come
down and see me, if you
come on a week day, call
at the Office of the New
Mill, if Sunday you will
find me at No. 17 New Village.

My regards - that
make me think of old Viall -
I understand he is a representa-
tive to the State Legislature
from Providence, hell of a
one at it - My regards
to you and yours.
