My Dear Brother

I received your letter in due time was glad to hear that you had a pleasant time and arrived home safe and sound but was sorry you did not come this way as you might of been at work now in the Armory I kept looking for you for two weeks before I got your letter I applied for a job for you and Joseph yesterday got a job for Joe with a promise for one for you if I had only applied for one and that one you I could of

got you the job but then you know  
you would of felt bad but I will  
do all I can for you and think I  
will succeed before long if I should  
get you a job can you be at a moment's  
notice for you know they dont want  
to wait long for a man tell Joe  
to come just as soon as he can for there  
is plenty ready to go to work at any time  
I will not write to him you can tell  
him about it if he should not want  
to come you can come and I am shure I  
can get you the job it will be 3.00  
per Day for Day work peace work  
they will let you make 3.25 I am working  
up the Day yet was when you was  
here dont know how long they will  
keep me so I hope not long

Now for some  
sad news Mamma Mary's Sister  
Died week ago last Monday I went  
down to see her they took the Boddy

to overmont Mary staid with the  
children untill they returned then came  
home about sick. talking about  
children I have got a Boy he will be  
four weeks old next Wednesday he  
is a smart boy just like his Father  
I dont know as I have any more to  
write that would interest you so  
I guess I will close give my love to  
Ann Mary & Ida join me in love  
to all hoping to hear from or see  
you soon
