JOURNAL OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION

Providence, Rhode Island

September 26, 1966

The Convention was called to order by Mr. Dennis J. Roberts, Chairman, at 1:46 P.M., pursuant to the following written notice:

"September 20, 1966

"To the Delegates to the Constitutional Convention:

"Pursuant to the action of the Convention at its last session, as Chairman, I am calling the next session of the Convention for Monday, September 26, 1966, at 1:30 P.M. in the Chamber of the House of Representatives.

"Enclosed is a list of the proposals which are in order for Second Reading. As you are well aware, because of an insufficient number of votes at the last session, it was impossible to proceed with the Article on the Legislative Power.

"In order for the Convention to proceed in an orderly manner and to reach a conclusion to its work, it is absolutely necessary that there be greater attendance at the sessions and a participation in the deliberations by all the delegates.

"A great deal of time and effort has been expended by a majority of the Delegates to this Convention in an effort to produce a new and revised Constitution for our state. Therefore, for the work of nearly two years to be nullified by the absence of a small number who thus make it impossible for a consideration to get the required fifty-one votes for final passage, appears to me to be unwarranted.

"The Chairman of the Committee on which you serve will call you and urge you to be present on Monday and at all future sessions of the Convention. If we can secure this increased attendance throughout sessions, in a relatively few meetings we can wind up the work of the Convention and present the document to the people.

"I know that you will cooperate in this matter.

"Sincerely yours, (signed) Dennis J. Roberts, Chairman"

INVOCATION

The Chairman presented Reverend John J. Mahoney, O.P., of Providence College, for the purpose of giving the Invocation.

The Invocation was given.

The roll of delegates was called; there were 90 present and 10 absent.

Absentees were Mrs. Capuano, Messrs. Cunningham, DeCiantis, Dodge, Gammino, Jordan, Mrs. Lacroix, Messrs. Moon, Parrillo and Sherry.

The names of the absentees were called.

On motion of Mr. Cochran, the delegates extended to Reverend Mahoney a rising vote of appreciation for his kindness in giving the Invocation.

On motion of Mr. Wexler, seconded by Mr. Dolbashian, reading of the Journal of the previous day was dispensed, on a voice vote.

SECOND READING OF PROPOSALS

The Convention continued consideration of the following proposal in which it had been engaged at adjournment of the previous session:

<u>Proposal No. 29, Substitute B</u> "Of the Legislative Power" (The Committee on Style and Drafting recommends adoption.)

(Sections 1 and 2 had been considered at the previous session of the Convention.)

Section 3 of the proposal was read.

Mr. Doris, seconded by Mr. Cochran, offered the following written motion to amend:

"I move to amend Section 3 of Proposal No. 29, Substitute B by deleting the word 'either' and inserting the word 'each' in place thereof."

On a division vote the motion prevailed, 64 delegates voting in the affirmative and 16 delegates voting in the negative.

Section 11 of the proposal was read.

Mr. Gallogly, seconded by Messrs. McKiernan and Doris, offered the following written motion to amend:

"I move to amend Section 11 of Proposal No. 29, Substitute B, by deleting therefrom the sentence:

"'Such consent shall not be given unless twenty percent of all eligible voters shall vote upon the proposal to incur any such debt.'"

"'2. The legislative power, under this Constitution, shall be vested in two houses, the one to be called the senate, the other the house of representatives; and both together the general assembly. The concurrence of the two houses shall be necessary to the enactment of laws. The style of their laws shall be, It is enacted by the general assembly as follows:'"
