JOURNAL OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION

Providence, Rhode Island

October 3, 1966

The Convention was called to order by Mr. Dennis J, Roberts, Chairman, at 2:16 P.M.

INVOCATION

The Chairman presented Reverend Aaron Usher, Vicar of St. Thomas Episcopal Church, Providence, for the purpose of giving the Invocation. The Invocation was given.

The roll of delegates was called; there were 83 present and 17 absent.

On a division vote the motion prevailed, 57 delegates voting in the affirmative and 0 delegates voting in the negative.

<u>Proposal No. 118</u> "Suffrage" (The Committee on Style and Drafting recommends rejection.)

The proposal was read.

Mr. Wexler, seconded by Messrs. McKiernan, Nathanson, Bride and Murray, moved that the proposal be rejected.

On a division vote the motion prevailed, 55 delegates voting in the affirmative and 0 delegates voting in the negative.

At 3:40 P.M. the Chairman again took the rostrum.

<u>Proposal No. 120</u> "Suffrage" (The Committee on Style and Drafting recommends rejection.)

The proposal was read.

Mr. Matzner, seconded by Messrs. Kanakry, McKiernan and Wexler, moved that the proposal be rejected.

On a division vote the motion prevailed, 53 delegates voting in the affirmative and 0 delegates voting in the negative.

<u>Proposal No. 148</u> "Of the Judicial Power" (The Committee on Style and Drafting recommends rejection.)

The proposal was read.

Mr. Cooney, seconded by Mr. Wexler, moved that the proposal be rejected.

The motion was debated.

On a division vote the motion to reject prevailed, 35 delegates voting in the affirmative and 11 delegates voting in the negative with more than 5 delegates present and not voting.

The proposal was read.

Mr. Willey, seconded by Messrs. Wexler, SaoBento and Lawrence, moved that the proposal be rejected.

On a division vote the motion prevailed, 52 delegates voting in the affirmative and 0 delegates voting in the negative.

<u>Proposal No. 21</u> "Election of General Officers" (The Committee on Style and Drafting recommends rejection.)

The proposal was read.

Mr. Dolbashian, seconded by Messrs. Cochran, Wexler, Lawrence and Murphy of Tiverton, moved that the proposal be adopted.

Mr. Doris, seconded by Mr. Beauchemin, moved that the proposal and the motion to adopt be laid on the table.

On a division vote the motion to lay on the table prevailed, 37 delegates voting in the affirmative and 15 delegates voting in the negative.

On suggestion of Mr. Doris, by unanimous consent, the Convention referred back to Reports of Standing Committees.
