JOURNAL OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION

Providence, Rhode Island

November 28, 1966

The Convention was called to order by Mr. Dennis J. Roberts, Chairman, at 1:58 P.M.

INVOCATION

The Chairman presented Reverend Roger M. Fortin, Chaplain at St. Joseph's Hospital, Providence, for the purpose of giving the Invocation. The Invocation was given.

The roll of delegates was called; there were 78 present and 21 absent.

Absentees were Mrs. Barber, Messrs. Beauchemin, Belhumeur, Colbert, DeCiantis, Dodge, Fanning of Cumberland, Feeney, Gallagher, Gammino, Jordan, Mrs. Lacroix, Messrs. LaFrance, Martin, Merolla, Moon, Murphy of Warren, Murphy of Coventry, Prince, Stapleton and Viall.

The names of the absentees were called.

On motion of Mr. DiLuglio, seconded by Mr. Cannon, Mr. Ernest A. Foster was elected Secretary Pro Tem in the absence of the Secretary of the Convention unanimously.

On motion of Mr. Cochran, seconded by Mr. Cannon, the reading of the Journal of the previous day was dispensed, on a voice vote.

On motion of Mr. Cochran, the delegates extended a rising vote of appreciation to Reverend Fortin for his kindness in giving the Invocation.

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES

Mr Kagan for the Committee on Elections and Right to Vote reported back that, after a duly advertised hearing was held thereon, by a vote of 8 to 3, the Committee recommended adoption of the following proposal:

Proposal No. 41, Substitute A "Article XVI Of the Adoption of this Constitution"

The proposal and report were accepted, referred to the Committee of the Whole and placed on the General Orders.

MOTIONS AND RESOLUTIONS

By unanimous consent Mr. Murray offered Resolution No. 35 (Fifteenth day of December, 1966, established as last date for introduction of proposals).

The resolution was read.

Mr. Murray requested unanimous consent for immediate consideration.

There was no objection.

Mr. Murray, seconded by Messrs. Pickard, Warren, Toolin and Wexler, moved passage of the resolution.

The motion prevailed on unanimous voice vote.

SECOND READING OF PROPOSALS

In order for Second Reading were the following proposals:

Proposal No. 39, Substitute A "Of Continuity of Government During An Emergency" (The Committee on Style and Drafting recommends adoption.)

The proposal was read.

At 2:15 P.M. the Chairman yielded the rostrum to Mr. David D. Warren, First Vice Chairman.

Mr. Corcoran, seconded by Messrs. Canna, Bride, Vacca, Wexler and Cooney, moved that the proposal be adopted.

The motion prevailed on a roll call vote, 68 delegates voting in the affirmative, 1 delegate voting in the negative and 30 delegates absent or not voting, as follows:

The proposal was read.

At 2:57 P.M. the Chairman again took the rostrum.

The proposal was read.

Mr. Wexler, seconded by Mr. Cochran, moved that the proposal be rejected.

On a division vote the motion prevailed, 57 delegates voting in the affirmative and 0 delegates voting in the negative.

<u>Proposal No. 202</u> "Term of Members of the House of Representatives" (The Committee on Style and Drafting reports out without recommendation.)

The proposal was read.

Mr. Doris, seconded by Messrs. Kagan, Cote and Lawrence, moved that the proposal be rejected.

On a division vote the motion prevailed, 36 delegates voting in the affirmative and 26 delegates voting in the negative.

The proposal was read.

Mr. Doris, seconded by Messrs. Lawrence, Cote and Kagan, moved that the proposal be rejected.

On a division vote the motion prevailed, 42 delegates voting in the affirmative and 23 delegates voting in the negative.

<u>Proposal No. 155, Substitute D</u> "Of Local Government" (The Committee on Style and Drafting recommends adoption.)

On suggestion of Mr. Cooney, by unanimous consent, the Convention dispensed with reading of the proposal.

Mr. Cooney, seconded by Messrs. Wexler, Lawrence and Cannon, moved that the proposal be adopted.

The motion was debated.

Mr. Corcoran, seconded by Messrs. Dolbashian and Bride, offered the following written motion to amend:

"I move to amend the second to last sentence of Section 6 of Proposal No. 155, Substitute D, by inserting the words 'regular election for local officers or the next' after the word 'next' and before the word 'general' in said sentence."

The motion was read.

The motion was debated.

On a division vote the motion to amend prevailed, 40 delegates voting in the affirmative, 3 delegates voting in the negative with more than 8 delegates present and not voting.

The proposal as amended was debated.

Mr. LaSalle, seconded by Messrs. Toolin and Nathanson, offered the following written motion to amend:

"I move to amend Proposal No. 155, Substitute D, by striking out Section 8 thereof."

The motion was read.

The motion was debated.

On a division vote the motion to amend did not prevail, 13 delegates voting in the affirmative and 37 delegates voting in the negative with more than 1 delegate present and not voting.

ADJOURNMENT

At 4:16 P.M., on motion of Mr. Coleman, seconded by Messrs. Cochran, Doris, Bizier and Parrillo, the Convention adjourned to meet on Monday, December 5, 1966, at 1:30 P.M. in the Chamber of the House of Representatives at the State House on a voice vote.
