Top Ten Reasons to Vote on September 30

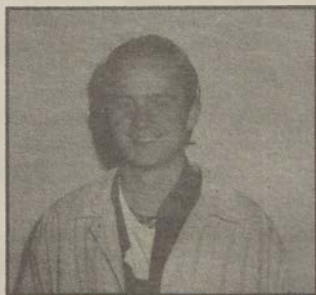
