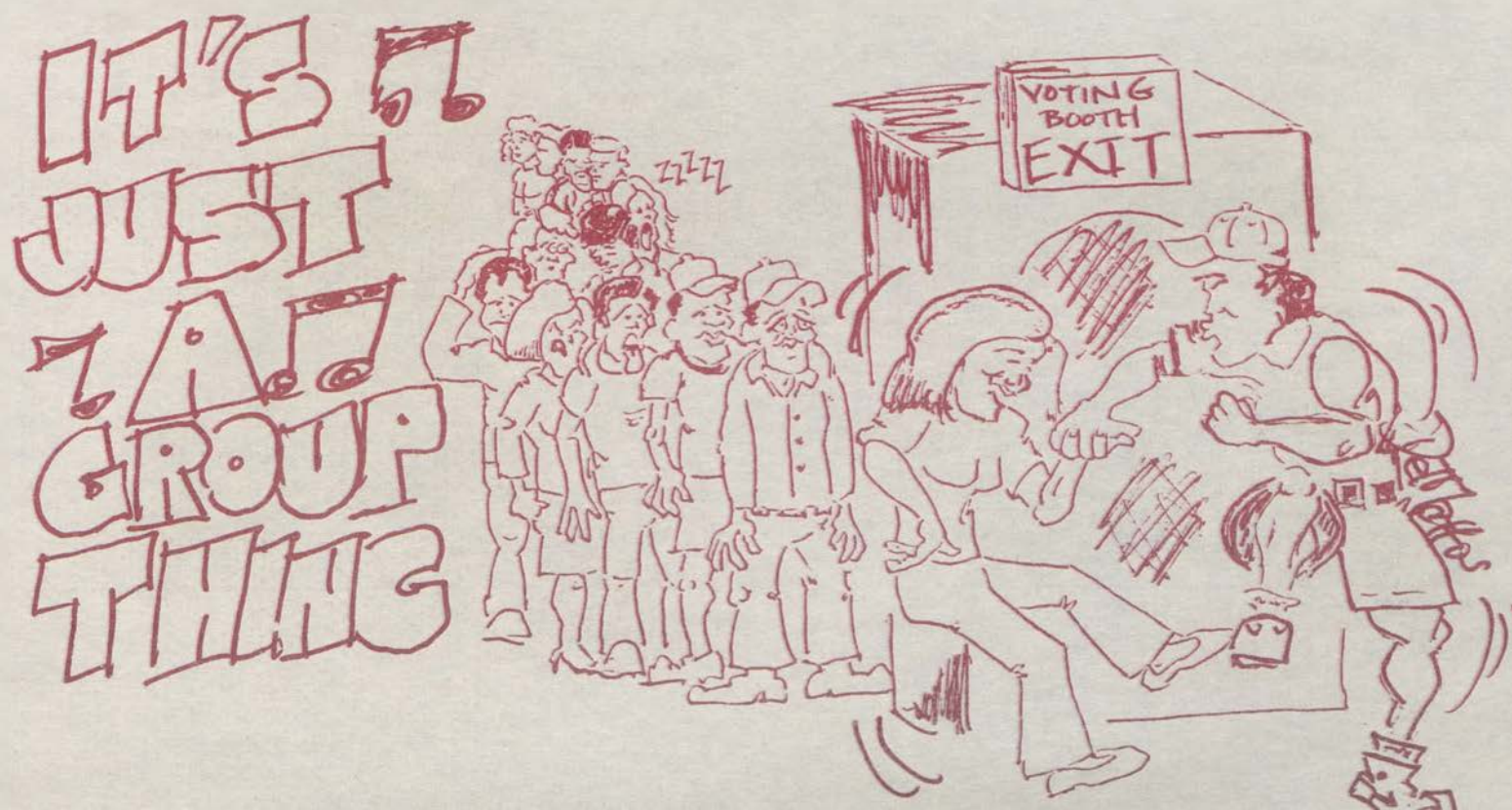
I believe that being
