## You Can Still Get Involved! Student Congress Appointed Positions

Election time will soon be over, but that doesn't mean that all opportunities to be on Student Congress have vanished. Each year, certain positions on Congress are appointed by the Executive Board. For those of you who are unfamiliar with what Student Congress is all about, it is the representative body of all of the students at Providence College. Congress deals with many complex issues that arise during the year and represent the student body's view on these issues to the faculty and administration. The organization is also responsible for running all elections and for allocating the Student Activity Fund to all clubs on campus. Student Congress can provide you with valuable leadership and managerial skills.

Although all executive positions have been elected and all class officers will be elected this week, there are positions that still need to be filled. These positions are the Parliamentarian; Committee on Administration

(COA) representative; Public Relations chair and two assistants; and two Student Lobbyists. If you are interested in there will be an informational meeting held on Monday, May 2, at 7:30 in Slavin 203. If you would like to apply, please schedule an interview for Tuesday, May 3 from 5:30-10:30 or Wednesday, May 4 from 6:30-8:00 and 9:00-10:30. Sign-up sheets will be in the Congress office.

PARLIAMENTARIAN serves as the Chief Justice of Student Congress and as the Chairperson of the Committee on Legislative Affairs. They should be well versed in parliamentary procedure and should have a knowledge of the legislative process. They will be drafting legislation concerning student issues.

COA Representative represents the views of the students to the Committee on Administration. They will attend all COA meetings and will report to Student Congress all information he/she feels affects the student body from these meetings.

PUBLIC RELATIONS representatives are respon-

sible for publicizing events that pertain to or are sponsored by Student Congress. There will be one person selected as a chair and two assistant chairs who will work together facilitating communication throughout congress and between other organizations. Some of the events include Midnight Madness, Walk-A-Thons, and Peaceful Co-existence distribution.

LOBBYISTS represent the PC student opinion as a lobbyist in the Rhode Island State Legislature and on campus. They will attend pertinent RI State Legislature and Committee meetings and will be well versed in the guide to the lobbying laws and Chapter 22-10 of the General Laws. They will inform Student Congress of important issues, thereby forming an affirmative plan to institute on issues affecting students. They will also attend all Faculty Senate Meetings. Lobbyists also chair the Academic Affairs Committee, the Bill of Rights Committee, and represent PC in the Rhode Island College and University State Senate (RICUSS).
